Humane Society of North Texas Welcomes 122 Shelter Pets Displaced by Hurricane Milton

Affected Pets are being Transported to North Texas by Wings of Rescue with Assistance from the Humane Society of the United States

WHO:

<u>Humane Society of North Texas</u> <u>Wings of Rescue</u> <u>Operation Kindness</u> <u>Humane Tomorrow</u> <u>SPCA of Texas</u> <u>Second Chance Farm</u> The Humane Society of the United States

WHAT:

The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT), SPCA of Texas, Operation Kindness, Humane Tomorrow, and Second Chance Farm has partnered with Wings of Rescue to take in a total of 122 shelter pets displaced due to the impacts of Hurricane Milton. These pets were already in shelters in the affected areas and have been relocated to North Texas to free up space for animals separated from their owners during the storm. By welcoming these 122 pets, North Texas shelters are helping local Florida shelters focus on reuniting pets with their families during this difficult time. Wings of Rescue and the Humane Society of the United States coordinated the evacuation of out of the impacted areas.

WHEN:

Friday, October 11, 2024; 3:30 p.m. (approximately) All transported pets will be made available for adoption following health evaluations.

WHERE:

WHY:

With most shelters in hurricane-affected regions already at capacity, it's crucial to create room for the anticipated influx of animals that may have been separated from their families due to the storm. Assistance from HSNT and other North Texas shelters ensures that lost pets can be cared for locally, while the pets being transported to Texas have a safe place to await adoption.

"At the Humane Society of North Texas, we are committed to helping pets and people in times of crisis," said Destiny Vandeput, Director of Communications for HSNT. "By partnering with Wings of Rescue, we now have an opportunity to provide a safe refuge for these shelter pets, while giving local Florida shelters the kennel space they need to take in animals separated from their owners due to Hurricane Milton. It's heartwarming to see the community come together to ensure that every pet has a safe place to go during this challenging time."
