## Humane Society of North Texas Receives Grant from Pedigree Foundation to Create Sensory Garden for Dog Enrichment

**April 4, 2024 – Fort Worth, Texas:** The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) is thrilled to announce a grant from the Pedigree Foundation to support the creation of a Sensory Garden at HSNT's main Fort Worth shelter. This innovative space will provide critical mental and physical enrichment for the shelter's dogs, engaging all five senses to reduce stress, encourage exercise, and foster desirable behaviors in a natural, therapeutic environment.

The Sensory Garden will be designed to create a peaceful, enriching outdoor area where dogs can enjoy activities that promote calm and well-being. HSNT plans to transform an outdoor play yard into a dynamic space that includes a **Dig Pit** for safe digging, **Scent Games** with scented logs for tracking, **Ramps and Tunnels** for climbing and agility, and other sensory-focused elements such as wind chimes and varied textures. These features will help lower cortisol levels, promote mental stimulation, and reduce undesirable behaviors, making the dogs more adoptable and easing their transition to forever homes.

"This Sensory Garden, made possible by the Pedigree Foundation, is an exciting development in our efforts to enhance the lives of shelter animals," said Destiny Vandeput, Director of Communications at HSNT. "This space will provide a safe and enriching environment, enabling our Behavior Department to work effectively with each dog to reduce stress, encourage positive behaviors, and prepare them for adoption."

Behavior Training is a critical program at HSNT that is designed to improve the adoptability and future well-being of each pet. Over the last six years, HSNT's live release rate has improved from 47% in 2016 to 97% in 2022 by building a transport program, improving medical care and addressing the behavioral needs of the pets in our care. Focused on the individual needs of each dog, the Behavior Training program is part of our high-quality care that also includes medical care and sheltering.
